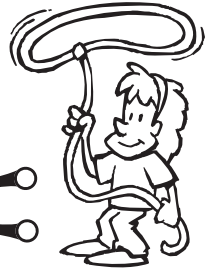

Round Up Parts of Speech

Standards Link: Grammar: Recognize parts of speech including verbs, nouns, adjectives and adverbs.

Spelling Buckaroos

Have your students cut out the letters that spell five or more of the words they each need to study. Have each student mix up his or her letters and then time the class to see who can use the letters to spell the words the quickest.

Standards Link: Spelling: Spell grade level appropriate words correctly.

Make a list of 10 jobs that appear in the Help Wanted ads. Which of these jobs existed 170 years ago? Think of a job that might have been available 170 years ago. Write a Help Wanted ad for that job.

Standards Link: Writing Applications: Write brief expository description.

4. Add students' name, school and grade.
5. Screen for appropriateness.

WEEK OF MAY 19

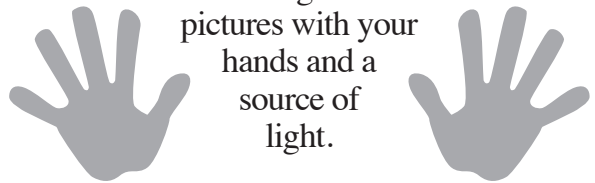
MEMORIAL DAY
