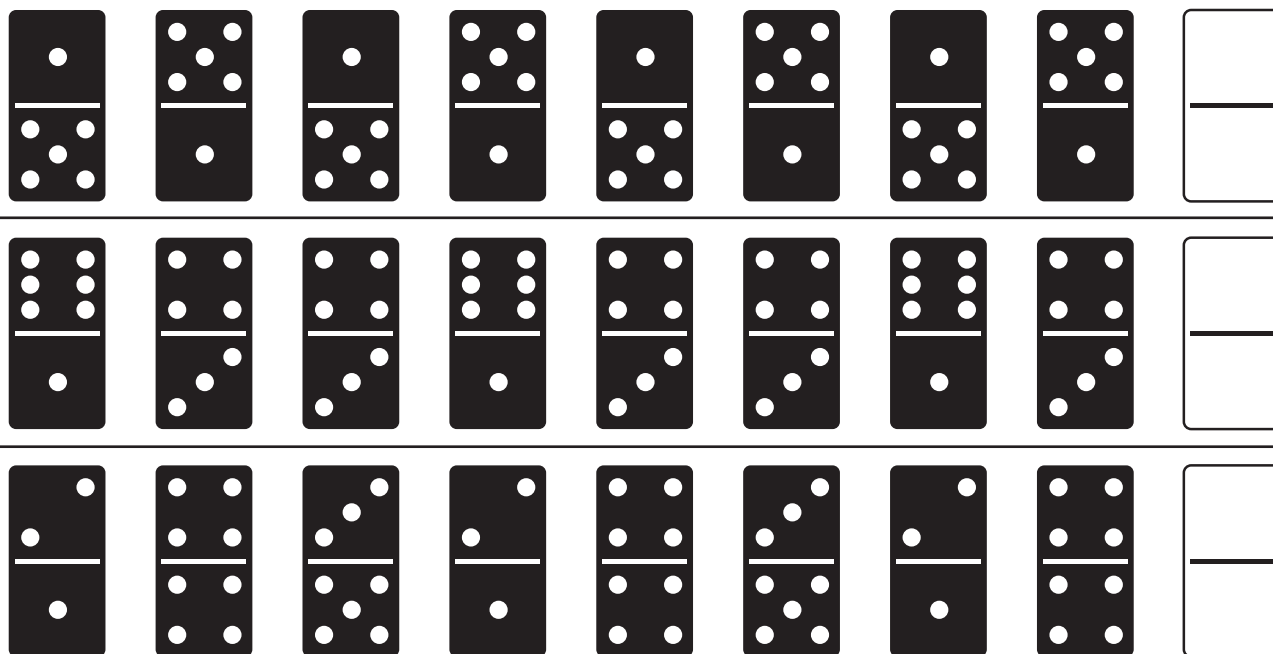
Can YOU Set a Record?

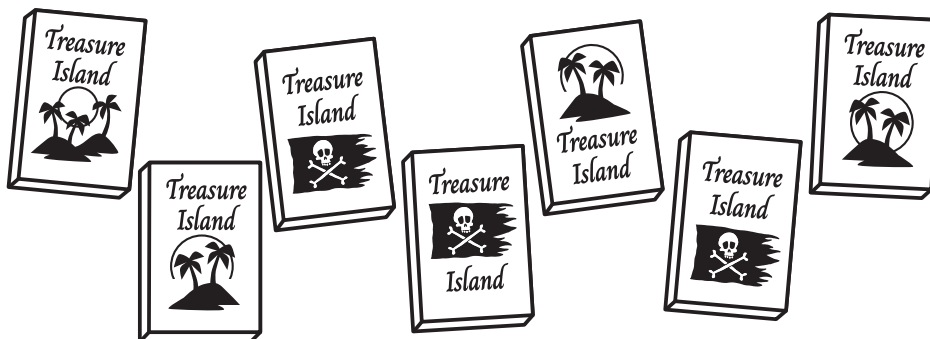
At the end of each row, draw the domino that will continue the pattern.

How many coins can you stack into a single tall tower in 60 seconds? The world record is 91 coins.

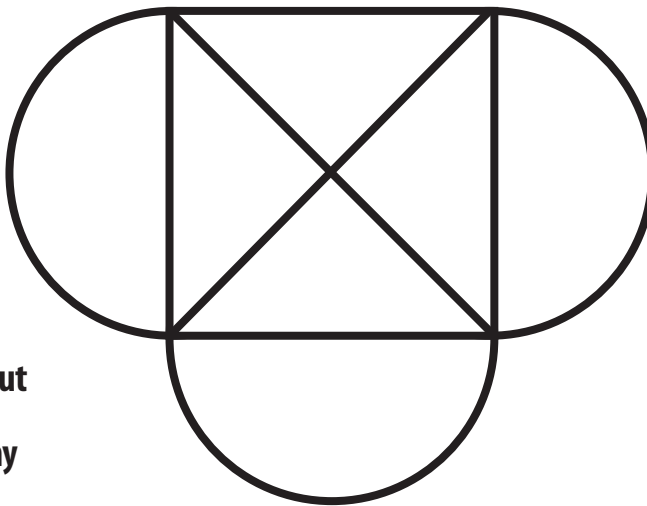


How many differences can you find between these two pictures?

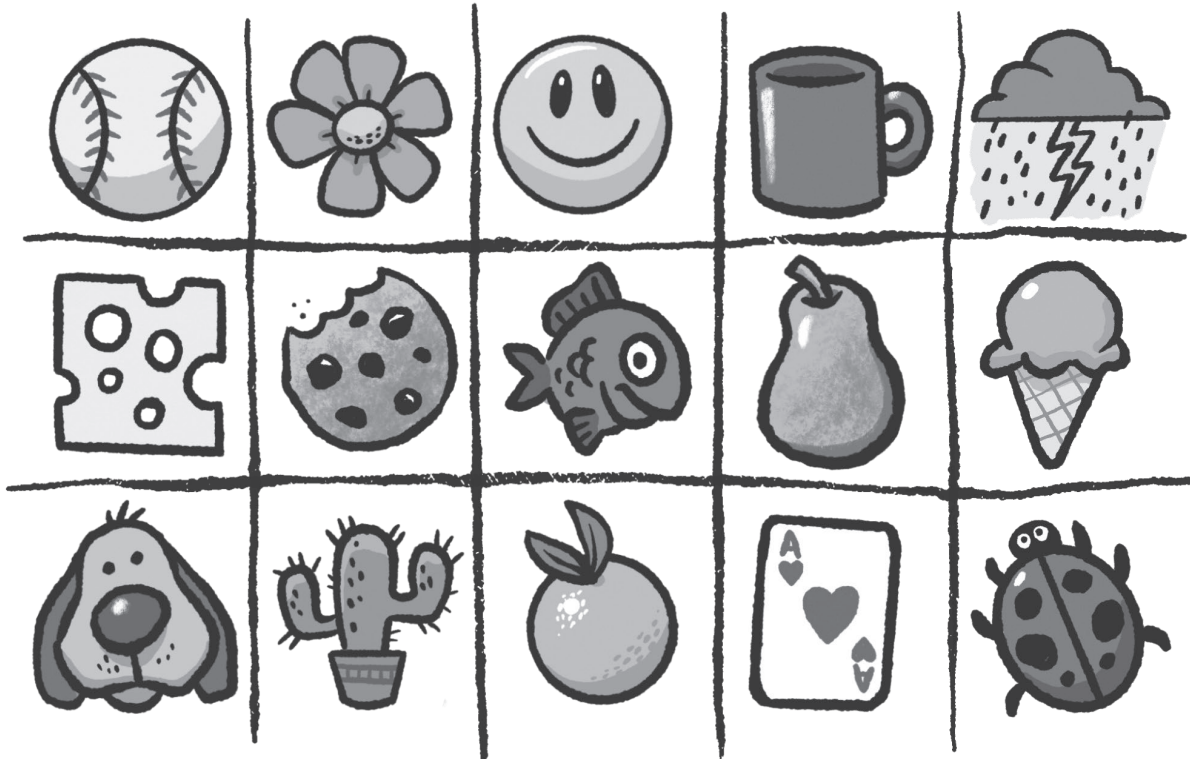

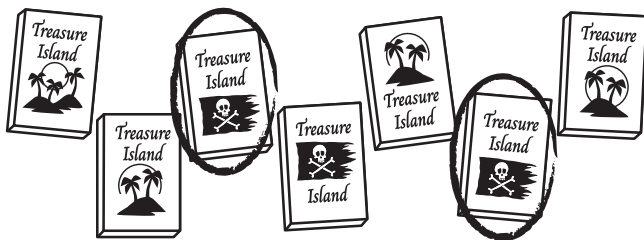
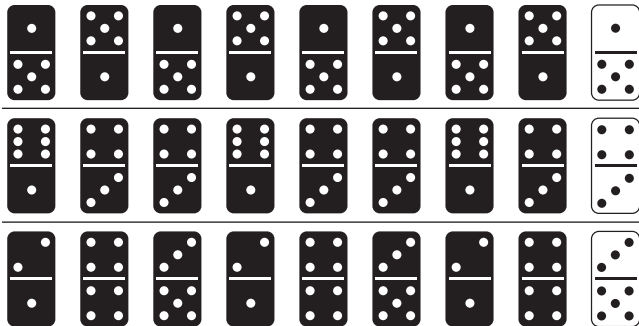
