Teachers: Here's a lesson to get your students using their creative juices as they overcome each obstacle in their path. Write the instructions on the board and give each student a newspaper...

The Journey Begins...

First you board a riverboat and travel slowly through swampy waters. Your boat gets stuck in the weeds. To find your way to the shore you must find three words in the newspaper that you think none of the other students will know. Look up the meaning of the words.

Language Lessons

You land at a small dock and are greeted by a group of natives. Their language is strange and you don't know what they want. In order to understand what they are saying, you must find three numbers in the newspaper that are divisible by six.

It's a Jungle Out There

Their chief leads your party into the dark jungle. It is hard to see where you're going and it feels like you're walking in circles. To help you on your way, look through the classified ads to find three items that will help you in the jungle.

Temple Troubles

At a clearing just ahead, you see a beautiful, gleaming temple. Find five adjectives in the newspaper that describe this temple. Now find five synonyms for each of your five adjectives. Your synonyms change everything and now your temple has changed into a dark and ominous place.




WHAT'S GNU?
